Our commitment

Oakstone Project Advisory Ltd is committed to making its website accessible and usable by as many people as reasonably possible, including people with disabilities and those using assistive technologies.

We recognise that accessibility is an important part of providing a professional and inclusive service. We therefore aim to design, develop and maintain our website in accordance with recognised accessibility good practice.

Accessibility standards

We aim for the Oakstone Project Advisory website to conform, wherever reasonably practicable, with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.2 Level AA.

These guidelines provide recommendations for making web content more accessible to people with a wide range of disabilities and access needs. Our approach is based on four core principles:

- Perceivable - information and interface components should be presented in ways users can perceive.
- Operable - website navigation and functionality should be usable through different methods of interaction.
- Understandable - information, navigation and functionality should be clear and consistent.
- Robust - content should work reliably with commonly used browsers, devices and assistive technologies.

This statement records Oakstone's accessibility aims and approach. It should not be read as a certification that every page or third-party component has passed a formal WCAG audit.

Using our website

We aim to make the website straightforward to navigate and understand. Where reasonably practicable, users should be able to:

- navigate the website using a keyboard;
- zoom and enlarge text without losing essential content or functionality;
- use the website with commonly available screen-reading technology;
- understand page headings and content through a logical structure;
- distinguish text from its background through appropriate colour contrast;
- understand important images through appropriate alternative text;
- identify links and interactive elements clearly;
- access the website across desktop, tablet and mobile devices; and
- access important information without relying solely on colour, images or visual presentation.

Documents and downloadable content

The website may contain downloadable documents, including PDF files, brochures, service information, reports or other professional material. We aim to make new documents accessible wherever reasonably practicable.

Some complex technical, graphical or third-party documents may not be fully accessible to every assistive technology. If you require information contained within a document in an alternative format, please contact us and we will consider reasonable ways of providing the information.

Limitations, support and review

Third-party content and services

Our website may contain links to external websites or use content, applications or services provided by third parties. We cannot control the accessibility of third-party websites or services. However, where reasonably practicable, we aim to select reputable providers and take accessibility into consideration when introducing third-party functionality.

Known accessibility limitations

Although we aim to make the website as accessible as reasonably practicable, some parts of the website may not yet fully meet all WCAG 2.2 Level AA criteria. Potential limitations may include:

- certain older or third-party PDF documents;
- embedded content supplied by third parties;
- maps or other externally provided interactive functionality;
- complex diagrams, plans or technical construction imagery; and
- accessibility issues introduced by third-party software, plugins or website integrations.

We will seek to address accessibility issues where they are identified and where it is reasonably practicable to do so.
